



- 6.1 The starting line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on the race committee vessel at the starboard end and the staff displaying an orange flag on the race committee vessel at the port end.
- 6.2 To alert boats that a race or sequence of races will begin soon, the orange starting line flag will be displayed with one sound at least five minutes before a warning signal is displayed.
- 6.3 Boats whose warning signal has not been displayed shall keep well clear of boats in a starting sequence or starting, including the extensions of the starting line.
- 6.4 A boat starting later than 4 minutes after her starting signal will be scored Did Not Start. This changes RRS 35, A4 and A5.1.

7 THE FINISH

- 7.1 The finishing line will be between a staff displaying a blue flag on the race committee vessel and the course side of the nearby finishing mark.

8 COMMUNICATIONS WITH COMPETITORS

- 8.1 When flag AP is displayed ashore, '1 minute' is replaced with 'not less than 60 minutes' in the race signal AP.
- 8.2 [SP] No boat shall leave her berthing area ashore until Flag D is displayed. When displayed with one sound means "The warning signal will be made not less than 60 minutes after flag D is displayed, competitors may launch".

9 CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 9.1 Any change to the intended format or schedule of races will be posted no later than 1 hour after the protest time limit, or by 2000, on the day before it will take effect, whichever is later.
- 9.2 Any change to the Sailing instructions Part 1 or 2 will be posted not later than 90 minutes before the first warning signal on the day it will take effect.

10 HEARINGS

- 10.1 The Jury office is located in the Regatta Village
- 10.2 Hearings will be held in the Jury Room in the Regatta Village.
- 10.3 Hearing request, equipment substitution and scoring enquiry forms can be found on the ONB.

11 SCORING

- 11.1 To request correction of an alleged error in posted race or series results, a boat may complete a scoring enquiry form available online on the ONB.

12. [DP] SUPPORT PERSON VESSELS AND PERSONNEL

- 12.1 Registered support vessels shall act as rescue boats in case of need. If the Race Committee displays flag V (see RRS 37) all support vessels shall monitor VHF channel 72 and comply with requests from the Race Committee and any published Safety Procedures.

13 OFFICIAL VESSELS

- 13.1 Official vessels will be marked as follows:
